


The Beer Garden will be open on Friday 4 p.m. to 12 a.m., Saturday and Sunday

They are selling raffle tickets for a half hog and another raffle that will have three winners (black stone griddle, \$250 Casey's card and a cooler filled with items and gift certificates from local businesses). These raffles will be available at the local shows. The proceeds from these raffles will go to help fund club projects.

Abbi moved to Nashville, Tennessee in 2014 to study under some of the most talented songwriters in the business. In 2015, she released her first three singles: "Flying," "Got My Own Shotgun" and "Yesterday's Daisies." After playing countless shows on Broadway and in other states, including CMA Fest, Abbi released "Love Wasn't Ready for Me," co-written by Eric Paslay, in 2016.

In 2018, Abbi graduated from Lipscomb University, where she served as the school's CMA ambassador, following in the footsteps of Dustin Lynch, Thomas Rhett and Kelsea Ballerina.

Abbi released "This is Me" in 2019 with well-known producer, Sal Oliver (producer of PINK). This EP was the necessary transition that Abbi had worked so hard to attain. "I've never felt more myself than I do now," said Scott. "I've learned a lot from being in Nashville, and I'm so ready for each step that greets me along the way."

Sharing the stage with some of biggest names in music and writing with Grammy winners has been a dream for Abbi, but you will never hear her shouting of her business. Minnesota and Texas gave Riggs an eclectic and wellrounded approach to his craft. As he performed out more and more, Riggs found a champion in a fan who connected him with several Nashville-based industry veterans. He began writing, recording, and releasing music, starting with his debut singles, "My Best Friend's a Girl" and "I'm Good," both of which laid the groundwork for Riggs at country radio.

His song "Tailgate Time" furthered his vocational footprint, leading to opening spots for country greats Justin Moore, Brett Eldredge, the Band Perry, Josh Turner, Colt Ford, Travis Tritt, and Alabama (to name a few) after a performance at the American Tailgaters Association's Super Bowl party. And in 2018, Riggs released his debut EP, "She's Everything."

Despite the difficulty that the 2020 global pandemic brought for the music industry at large, Riggs continued to power forward.

He leaned into some of Nashville's top songwriting talent for new material in preparation for 2021.

"It's all about the song," said Levi. "As much as I like to write, I always feel the best song should win - whether I write it or not." A moment of calm in a normally hectic lifestyle, the slow-down gave Riggs the opportunity to reassess his career - and take steps that were sonically refreshing while even more, at core, who Riggs truly is.
